 A graduate student is considered full-time when they are enrolled in 9 credit hours or more; 6 credit hours and under is considered part-time status. If a graduate student only takes one course in the Summer, they are not eligible for Financial Aid. Students need to take 6 credit hours to be eligible for Financial Aid any semester. Typically, the graduate school loan is divided three ways between Summer, Fall and Spring.

Candidates can apply for initial school counseling certification to practice as a school counselor after the completion of the required 48 credit hours (M.S.Ed.). Professional certification can be obtained after completion of 12 additional credit hours of study (60 credit hours) in the certificate of advanced studies program *and* three years of work experience as a school counselor.
