

GALLY GOLD: A declining balance and available to spend at Gally and the Dining Commons.




CAMPUS FUNDS: Can be used anywhere on campus that accepts the Student ID card.



 A safe environment created to support and complement students' academic experiences

 Four year transformation from freshman to adult

First year students live in Seton and O'Shea in freshman communities

Two dedicated Community Advisors on their floor

- As sophomores and above, they choose their own rooms
- Room assignments were sent on June 27 to their NU emails





Two Year Residency Requirement

- University-wide policy
- Unless student lives within 50 miles and commutes from family home, is 21, married, etc.
- Student must complete at least their first and second years on campus
- But housing is guaranteed for all 4 years!
- Why stay for two years at least?
 - Greater academic success
 - Greater rate of persistence to graduation
 - Safety

4 year graduation rate

- 4 year commuters graduate at 70%
- 4 year residents graduate at 94%







Why live on campus for all four years?

- Earn higher GPA
- Are more likely to graduate
- Are more likely to interact with faculty
- Are more likely to assume leadership roles
- Are more likely to attend cultural events
- Are more likely to utilize campus resources
- Report greater satisfaction with their college experience
- Connections, Support & Convenience
- Being "all in" on this new intense academic experience



Who is there to help my student if they need it?

- Community Advisors upperclass students,
 2-3 on duty each night, 2 on each floor
- Residence Directors professional staff who live in residence and can respond to emergencies 24/7
- Campus Safety does rounds in the buildings,
 can respond to emergencies 24/7
- Associate Director, Assistant Deans,
 Dean of Students on call 24/7 for emergencies
- We take student safety seriously and we will call you if there's an emergency with your student.





Roommates

- All of the printed materials you and your student receive today can serve as a reference guide for you during the year if trouble arises
- Our belief is that having a roommate is an incredibly important part of their development and their college experience
- We have many support systems and safety nets in place for students in case they hit a bump in the road
- We encourage communication with roommates as issues arise prior to a room switch
- Please encourage them to tell us EARLY on if something isn't working out so we have time to find a better solution for them
- Differences are <u>expected</u>. Diversity is a cornerstone of our community and Vincentian mission.
